- I. A new meaning of some word(s) in the sentence.
  - A. Monroe Beardsley's version of this view.
  - B. Davidson's objections.
- II. John Searle's principles.
  - A. Principles determining the *possible* contents 'S is R' of a metaphor 'S is P'.
  - B. Principles determining which of these possible contents are actual.
  - C. Objections to Searle.
- III. The content of a comparison.
  - A. Standard objections to comparison theories.
    - 1. To the claim that the content is just the proposition *that Juliet is like the sun*.
    - 2. To the claim that the content is the proposition *that Juliet is like the sun in being F, G, H*.
  - B. Kinds of comparison theory.
    - 1. The content is the figurative content of a comparison. (Robert Fogelin)
    - 2. The content is the literal content of a comparison. (Severin Schroeder)

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
